





Year 2 Autumn Term Phonics Screening Check

Phonics Screening Check

- In June, Year 1 usually have the 'Phonics Screening Check'. As this did not take place last year, the children will sit it towards the end of November this year.
 - The phonics screening check is a quick and easy check of your child's phonics knowledge. It helps to inform us where they may need further input.
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How the check works

- Your child will sit with a teacher he or she knows and be asked to read 40 words.
 - Your child may have read some of the words before, while others will be completely new.
 - The check will consist of 20 'real' words and 20 'Alien/nonsense' words.
 - The check normally takes just a few minutes to complete but there is no time limit.
 - If your child is struggling, the teacher will stop the check. The check is carefully designed not to be stressful for your child.

Why use Alien words?

- The check will contain a mix of real words and 'alien' (or 'nonsense words'). Your child will be told before the check that there will be 'Alien/nonsense' words that he or she will not have seen before.
- Your child will be familiar with this because the school already uses 'Alien words' when they teach phonics.
- Alien or nonsense words are important to include because words such as 'vap' or 'jound' are new to **all** children. Children cannot read these by using their memory or vocabulary; they have to use their decoding skills. **This is a fair way to assess their ability to decode new words.**

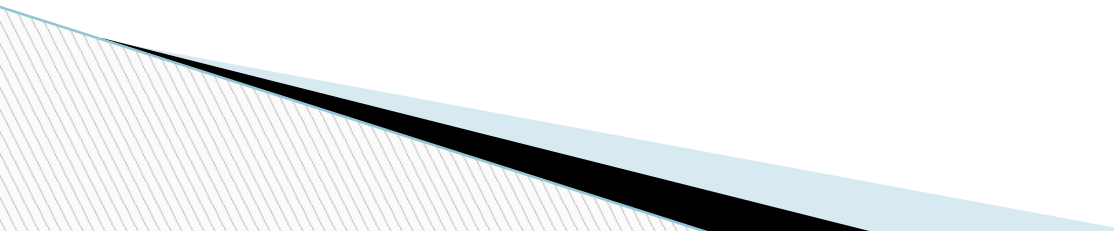
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
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After the check

- Your child will need to read the majority of the 40 words correctly.
 - We do not know exactly how many as this will be decided after the check has been carried out and the results have been submitted to the Local Authority.
 - You will be informed of your child's score before the end of the academic year.
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Children not reaching the threshold

- All children are individuals and develop at different rates.
 - If your child has found the check too difficult, the school will inform you of what support they will put in place to help him/her improve.
 - Your child **may** retake the check in June 2022 – we will follow the local authority's guidelines.
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Supporting your child at home

- Phonics works best when children are given plenty of encouragement and learn to enjoy reading and books.
- Parents play a very important part in helping with this.
